THE CONFERENCE:

The goal of this year's CAPE conference is to engage the community of police educators in active discussion around accountability, evidence based training, and technological advancements which will influence the future.

CAPE attendees will be divided into small groups. These small groups will meet with a representative of each of the different delivery units of the RCMP Training Academy, tour the facilities, and explore the challenges and solutions faced by police educators in relation to that discipline.

Participants will attend a variety of presentations, each of which will be followed by an opportunity for collaborative exploration of the subject presented.

WHO:

Any person who is engaged in police education or training with a recognized police training facility.

REGISTRATION:

COST:

The conference is \$100.00.

If you choose to stay in Barracks Quarters (single student rooms) the cost is \$75 per day, which includes room, refreshment breaks and meals. Rooms must be booked and paid for at the time of registration.
