



## **Effective and Defensible Training Through Collaboration**

The Canadian Association of Police Educators (CAPE) promotes excellence in law enforcement training and education through the guidance of innovative research, program development, knowledge transfer, network facilitation, and collaborative training initiatives.

### **THE CONFERENCE:**

In the changing landscape of police training many agencies are stretching their resources to do more with less. The goal of this year's CAPE conference is to promote discussion on hot topics in police training, highlighting collaboration as a mechanism to achieve effective and defensible training within the current economic climate.

Sessions at the conference are designed to be short, fast-paced presentations followed by facilitated group discussions, panel discussions, or question and answer sessions with panelists to promote interaction and critical thinking. Innovations in police training in BC will be showcased throughout the conference and scheduled updates from various organizations and committees will promote collaboration. A limited-capacity pre-CAPE workshop on curriculum mapping will be offered for a small additional fee. This workshop will involve working both pre-workshop and during the session to map police training curriculum to the Police Sector Council National Framework of Police Competencies.
